

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER The Fourth

Sunday of Easter is known as Vocations
Sunday or Good
Shepherd Sunday, and is marked as the World
Day of Prayer for
Vocations. The Fourth
Sunday of Lent (Laetare

Sunday) receives its name from the Latin word for "rejoice." Many of us undoubtedly remember that this is the Sunday when rose is worn by the priest, when flowers once again decorate what was otherwise a barren sanctuary. The purpose of this day is to fulfil Jesus' instruction to "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:38). Our Baptismal call is towards lives of holiness and love. We live this out in various ways through a vocation that might entail ordination to the priesthood, religious, married, or single life, or a commitment to a particular ministry. The word 'vocation' comes from the Latin word that means 'calling'. For the Christian a vocation is not just something that God calls us to do, it is also the person God calls us to be. Every baptised Christian shares in the universal call to holiness and to be like Our Lord Jesus Christ.

SAINT CATHERINE OF SIENA (APRIL

29) One of four women honoured with the title of Doctor of the Church, Catherine was born in Siena, Italy, in 1347, her parents' twenty-fifth and youngest child. At the age of seven, following a vision of Christ in glory, she is reported to have vowed her virginity to God. She joined the Dominican Third Order in 1365, spending years in seclusion from the world, fasting

and praying. In 1368, after a vision where Christ accepted her as his "bride," she felt called to carry this love to others. She cared for the poor and tended the sick; she corresponded with people from all walks of life, even counselling princes and popes; she was renowned as a peacemaker. She is especially remembered for her spiritual reflections. She is the Patron Saint of Europe, Italy, and Fire Protection.
