MARCH 17, 2024 FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

PALM SUNDAY for the year 2024 is observed on Sunday, **MARCH 24.** Palm Sunday, which is the Sunday before Easter Sunday and the start of Holy Week is a feast day commemorating Jesus's entry into Jerusalem on a Donkey (symbolizing peace versus a horse which symbolized war).

HOLY WEEK: Éaster is right around the corner! But before we jump into egg hunts and Easter decorations, there is Holy Week. This religious week takes place from Sunday, MARCH 24, to Saturday, MARCH 30, 2024, which is considered some of the most sacred seven days out of the Christian calendar year. It's a time to commemorate and learn about the events leading up to Jesus Christ's death. The first day that commences Holy Week is Palm Sunday, a day where Jesus was celebrated and welcomed when entering the city of Jerusalem.

WHAT IS HOLY WEEK? Holy Week is an important time for Christians throughout the world. Holy Week, the final week of Lent, begins on Palm Sunday, the Sunday before Easter. Holy Week is a time when Catholics gather to remember and participate in the Passion of Jesus Christ. The Passion was the final period of Christ's life in Jerusalem. It spans from when He arrived in Jerusalem to when He was crucified.

HOW DO CATHOLICS CELEBRATE HOLY WEEK? Four special ceremonies commemorate the events of Christ's Passion from His entrance into Jerusalem, when palm branches were placed in His path, through His arrest on Holy Thursday and Crucifixion on Good Friday, to Holy Saturday, the day that Christ's body lay in the tomb. The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.



FEAST OF ST. PATRICK: St. Patrick of Ireland is one of the world's most popular saints. He was born in Roman Britain and when he was fourteen, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd and tend sheep. At the time, Ireland was a land of Druids and pagans but Patrick turned to God and wrote his memoir, The Confession. Patrick's captivity lasted until he was twenty. A few years after returning home, Patrick saw a vision that prompted his studies for the priesthood. He was ordained by St. Germanus and was later ordained a bishop and sent to take the Gospel to Ireland. He often used shamrocks to explain the Holy Trinity and

entire kingdoms were eventually converted to Christianity after hearing Patrick's message. After years of living in poverty, traveling and enduring much suffering he died March 17, 461.

"THE BREASTPLATE," PATRICK'S POEM OF FAITH AND TRUST IN GOD: "Christ be within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ inquired, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger."
