

APRIL 28, 2024 FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER



The FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER IS THE SUNDAY FOUR WEEKS after the Christian celebration of Easter. 5th Sunday Serve is inspired by Galatians 5:13-14. It reads: 13 You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to

indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love. 14 For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." This day is also known as Cantate Sunday due to the incip "Cantáte Dómino" (Sing to the Lord) of the introit assigned to this day in the Roman Rite. It involves actively seeking the best for another person without seeking anything in return. This is what Jesus is calling us to when he says, "love one another." We are to take care of one another's needs, pray for one another, and seek the best for one another, which ultimately is found in faith in God. Reflect on who you need to love better than you have. Then, reach out to them in Christ's love.



THE MONTH OF MAY IS THE MONTH OF MARY. May is the Month of Mary. For centuries, the Catholic Church has set aside the entire month of May to honor Mary, Mother of God. Not just a day in May, but the entire month. The month of May is Mary's month. It's the month we honor Blessed Mary as the Mother of Jesus and our Heavenly Mother.
